Number one for choice

Begin pilot training on solid ground

AVIATION in Australia continues to be a vocation where some of the biggest challenges facing potential pilots are the initial application and selection processes.

Stealth Training equips potential pilots with skills needed to undertake pilot selection processes for the military and major civilian companies. The course will assist any budding pilot in fulfilling an ambition to fly aircraft for a career.

The organisation's training director and program developer, Adrian Rosevear, says: "We noted the latest available statistics revealed that of the 2200 applicants who applied for pilot selection for the Australian Department of Defence over two consecutive

years, only 112 were successful in gaining positions in pilot courses.

"With my 15 years of experience as a military pilot, eight of those as a pilot instructor, we thought, what can be done to assist people in achieving their dream?"

"After further market research, it became apparent there was a need for a training course that serviced potential applicants for a majority of pilot selection processes, not just the military.

"Stealth Training was then born."

The course runs over two consecutive full days and covers areas of preparation for the aviation selection process, from interview techniques and preparation, aptitude test techniques and leadership skills to essential



knowledge about career paths and aircraft.

The course emphasises learning from experience, not just from books, and the practical aspects of the course, such as interview and leadership exercises, can prove extremely useful for candidate preparation for the selection processes.

With its courses initially held in Adelaide, Perth, Melbourne, Brisbane and Sydney, Stealth Train-

ing has plans to expand further should demand continue.

"The name Stealth Training encapsulates the nature of the flying done in the military," Mr Rosevear says.

"Stealth is all about gaining the edge over opponents and thus the course encourages participants to gain the competitive edge in their quest to achieve their pilot wings.

flying high-performance aircraft, such as the AP3C Orion and PC9, that I wish for every one of the participants in Stealth Training to have the same experiences I have had. Flying is such an exciting career that can take you all over the globe and can be very rewarding at the same time."

A Stealth Training course will be held this weekend at the Lakes Resort, West Lakes.

Stealth Training director and SA course facilitator Adrian Rosevear is a Squadron Leader and qualified military flying instructor with 17 years' experience in the Royal Australian Air Force, 15 of those as a pilot.

With eight years of pilot training experience, Mr Rosevear says he has the skills and qualifications to deliver a comprehensive course focusing on the competency areas required to prepare students for pilot selection processes and to achieve their pilot wings.
