
Frequently Asked Questions

1. Is the course suitable for Airline Cadet Schemes?

Yes, the course caters for cadet scheme selection processes for the major airlines. The aptitude tests discussed on each course are tailored for the participants. In this way, the tests you will be confronted with on selection for the cadet scheme will be discussed during day 1, and the workbook will have practice questions for further study.

2. Is the course suitable for year 11 and year 12 students?

Yes. Attending the course at this stage of school allows for time to implement study strategies and tailor subjects to maximise chances on selection processes. Further, it gives participants a non-biased introduction to a career as a pilot, allowing them to make informed decisions in time to change subjects if required.

3. How long after completing the course should I apply to ADF/Civilian companies?

It is best to leave a minimum of 1 to 2 months after the course to ensure sufficient time to consolidate.

4. What topics are covered?

Day 1 covers the following:

- Introduction to recruitment process aims.
- General aptitude tests (basic math, english comprehension, verbal analogies, logic patterns, cubes, mechanical comprehension, graphical reading and interpretation, essay writing).
- Pilot Specific aptitude tests (aviation reasoning, numerical approximation, spatial awareness language and instrument, Instrument comprehension).
- Practice aptitude test.

Day 2 covers the following:

- Basic leadership theory and leadership exercise.
- Interview techniques and preparation.
- Interview role play.
- Aviation instruction (flight screening and simulator testing).

5. What does the workbook cover?

The workbook is an interactive 400 page study aid that follows the two day course and provides participants with a "one stop shop" for information on selection processes.

6. What if I have successfully completed the aptitude testing for the ADF and have passed. Is the course still worthwhile?

Yes. The course content is covered over two days. See question 4 for course content. You will most likely benefit from attending day two as you still have the interview stage of the selection process to undertake. You are able to elect to attend day two only at a cost of \$400.00. 7. Can I purchase the workbook without attending a course?

8. Is there any study required before the course?

There is no formal study required, or pre-requisites needed to attend the course. It is recommended that participants have as a minimum grounding in basic math and English at year 10 level sufficient to continue at year 11 & 12 levels after the course.

9. Is the course suitable for non-pilot applicants?

Yes. Although directed at pilot selection for ADF and civilian companies, non-pilot applicants to the military and flight attendant applicants will benefit, especially from day 2 (interview and leadership training). Attendance on day 1 is also suitable as the general aptitude tests are suitable for non-pilot ADF officer applicants.

10. Is there a flying component with the course?

At this stage no. However, Stealth Training will provide a preferred list of Flying Training Schools who are able to provide appropriate flying training.

11. Does Stealth Training offer other services?

12. Will the course discuss ADFA and OTS?

Not in detail. The amount of information that would need to be covered is prohibitive for the two day course. The workbook does however have a chapter dedicated to ADFA/OTS requirements and references along with links to guide further study.

13. How many students to a course?

To ensure maximum learning, course sizes are capped at 15 students.

14. What do I need to bring?

Bring a non-scientific calculator, one that is easy to use with large buttons and screen.

15. What if I fail a recruiting stage, can I come back and re-do the course?

Yes, a second attendance is charged at 50%. You must bring your original workbook and will be provided with any updates as required.
